



Voters with Disabilities

Based on needs and preferences, Salt Lake County has several options available to help voters with disabilities cast their ballots. These options include:

- Voting and returning a by-mail ballot.
- Voting at an in-person vote center using assistive technology.
- Receiving a link via email to cast a secure electronic ballot.

Instructions

Elections in Salt Lake County are conducted mainly by mail. Early Voting and Election Day vote centers are also available for in-person voting. Please read the following instructions carefully to ensure your ballot will be counted.

2026 Primary Election Important Dates

- Primary ballots mailed: June 2
- Early Voting begins: June 9
- Voter registration deadline: June 12
- Last day to request a by-mail ballot: June 16
- **Election Day: June 23**

Vote Your Ballot

1. Fill in the ovals with a blue or black pen.

- You do not need to vote in every contest. Your ballot will still be counted if some contests are left blank.
- If you make a mistake, cross out the entire name and oval and fill in the oval of your correct choice.
- Voting for more than the number of eligible seats in a contest will result in your vote in that contest not being counted.

2. Fold your ballot along existing fold lines.

3. Place your ballot in the return envelope with **YOUR NAME** printed on the outside.

4. Sign your name in the signature box on the back of the envelope.

5. Write the last four digits of your Utah Driver's License/State ID **OR** the last four digits of your Social Security Number in the spaces provided on the back of the envelope.

6. Close and secure the envelope.

7. If your ballot is damaged, contact our office to receive a replacement ballot.

Return Your Ballot

You may return your signed and completed ballot in one of three ways:

1

By U.S. Postal Mail

Please note: **all ballots must be in the County Clerk's possession by 8 p.m. on Election Day**, regardless of postmark.

2

Through a ballot drop box

View the list of locations on the reverse side or visit the County Clerk's website to see all locations, open until 8 p.m. on Election Day.

3

At an in-person vote center

Open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day. Visit the Clerk's website for locations.

Reasons Your Ballot May Not Be Counted

1. Your ballot is received by the Clerk too late.
2. Your return envelope is not signed.
3. Driver's License/ State ID or last four of SSN was not provided on return envelope.
4. Your signature doesn't match the signature on file.
5. Your ballot was placed in another voter's envelope.



- Check our website to see if any candidates have withdrawn or been disqualified.
- If you decide to vote in-person:
 - Identification is required to cast your ballot.
 - You may vote at any county vote center, regardless of where you reside in the county.
- Each envelope is unique. Make sure **YOUR NAME** is on the outside of the return envelope before you sign it.
- Even with permission you may not sign another person's envelope.
