SUBJECT: Your Vote is Important! Additional Action Required.

We received your 2025 Primary Election Ballot. However, the signature on your ballot envelope does not match the signature we have on file <u>or</u> the voter affidavit on your envelope was not signed. Utah law requires that a voter must sign their ballot envelope affidavit, and the signature must match the signature on the voter's registration form for the ballot to be counted.

NOTE: For valid ballots returned timely, we continue to process voter affidavits received during the canvassing period after the election. Your ballot will be counted and included in the final certified results once your signature is verified.

If you are unable to sign your name consistently or need accommodation due to a qualifying disability, please select the box at the bottom of the form and return it to us.

Please complete the steps listed below as soon as possible. Your information must be received in our office no later than noon on August 25, 2025.

VOTER AFFIDAVIT

Read the Declaration

I do solemnly swear that I am a qualified resident voter and that I am entitled to vote in this election. I am not a convicted felon currently incarcerated for commission of a felony.

It is illegal to forge a signature or cast another person's ballot. Attempting to vote when not qualified, attempting to vote more than once, or falsely signing this oath is a felony punishable by a maximum imprisonment of five years, a maximum fine of \$10,000, or both.
