Change Management Training

There have been significant changes the past 2 years for all: employees, families, companies, communities, and countries. The communities we serve experienced an earthquake, civil unrest, hurricane-force winds, and a global pandemic. Millions of people lost their jobs, and millions of retailers, restaurants, and other businesses shut down. Workplaces everywhere were disrupted, including ours.

You as a county employee were challenged to implement rapid changes and adapt to the new working conditions, either by working from home, being redeployed, or by adopting new protocols and rules for safety at your workplace. The reset of work practices was implemented and impacted all. No one was untouched. Change is here to stay. Change is all around us. Either in our personal or work lives we are asked to manage change for the better, and yet change also unfolds resistance.

This in-person <u>Change Management course</u> on June 14 focuses on planning and managing change and provides frameworks and tools to implement it. It emphasizes the forces for change, types of change, and the (planned) change implementation process, including dealing with the natural resistance to change.
