Commissioner Salazar called the meeting to order at the Salt Lake County Government Center, Room S2-830, this meeting was also available via-Webex. Commissioner Salazar turned the time over to Carita Lucey to present the entry and lateral exam plans and then will open to public comment at the end.

Carita Lucey went over the following information regarding the exam plan:

Agenda item 1- Entry Level Exam Plan

- Adding to the minimum qualifications must have completed the nation police officers standardized test NPOST with a passing score of 70% or higher overall score. This test is not required through POST but will help us raise the bar of our applicants now that our vacancy numbers are lowering.
- Adding a link of locations that can take the NPOST and how they submit their scores during their hiring process.
- Removing the oral interview portion after the physical fitness test.
- Changing the background interview to be weighted at 60% instead of pass/fail.

Commissioner David Salazar opened the meeting to public to comment.

Matt Thompson with the Salt Lake Valley Law Enforcement Association supports adding the NPOST to the entry level exam plan.

Lieutenant Scott Laughlin clarifying that 70% is the minimum for the NPOST but due to the number of applicants we can raise the banding on the test scores.

Lieutenant Mark Haws stated that he appreciates bringing back the NPOST test and is supportive.

Commissioner Stonebrook recommended some formatting changes to provide clarity.

Commissioner Salazar moved to approve the entry level exam plan. Commissioner Stonebrook seconded the motion to approve and passed unanimously.

Agenda item 2- Lateral Level Exam Plan

- Adding more information to the clarification to the exam content
 - Background interview process
 - Final interview process

Commissioner Salazar opened the meeting to public to comment.

Chief Deputy Kari Huth stated that she was supportive of both exam plans.

Public comments for the entry level exam plan were closed by Commissioner Salazar.

Commissioner Salazar requested adding more clarification to the lateral exam plan of this exam plan being for all three bureaus in the exam content section.

Commissioner Stonebrook motioned to approve the lateral exam plan with the changes that were made during the meeting.

Commissioner Salazar added an additional comment to cover the verbiage changes that were made to the entry exam plan. Commissioner Salazar seconded the motion to approve and passed unanimously.
